Recreational Trail Program (RTP) grant awards are available to the State of North Dakota and its political subdivisions in order to assist in the development, maintenance or rehabilitation of recreational trails. The RTP is an assistance program of the U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). The program is administered by the Recreation Division of the North Dakota Parks and Recreation Department.

Project proposals must be approved at the state and federal levels. A Recreation Trails Committee of private, state and federal individuals evaluates and ranks the projects. Projects selected at the state level are submitted to the FHWA for federal review and approval.

RTP grants reimburse up to 80 percent of the cost for development, maintenance or rehabilitation of recreational trails. The maximum federal grant award is \$200,000. Engineering fees exceeding more than 20% of total project cost are not eligible for reimbursement. Project sponsors cannot be reimbursed for funds that are incurred before an application is approved and a local grant agreement is signed.

The application deadline is January 31<sup>st</sup> 2014 at 1:00pm CST. Applications must be submitted on or before that date and time. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered.

You may press SAVE at any time, as long as you have filled out a bare minimum of the application. A **Red \*** will appear next to those fields that are required. Once you have successfully saved your application, you will be able to add federal and local funding sources by pressing the newly visible ADD FEDERAL FUNDING SOURCE and ADD LOCAL FUNDING SOURCE buttons located at both the top and bottom of the page. 



Koser Field Walking Trail Grant Information  
**Project Description**


**Project Description:**

Watford City's existing walking trail serves to connect many of the existing facilities in the city such as grade school, high school, downtown, parks, skating rink, etc. Within the last two years several facilities (a housing subdivision, several retail stores, and a softball/baseball field) have been constructed to which there are no paths that connect them. Seventh Street SE has become much busier with car and pedestrian (many of which are children) traffic due to the new facilities. This increase in car traffic creates a safety hazard for pedestrians who are walking on the roadway. The planned project is to construct a new 1050 ft long walking path from Bolken Park to Koser Field along 7<sup>th</sup> St SE. (Reference Attachment A) The addition of this path will serve to provide a route that is off the street for pedestrians and cyclists. This trail will be a connection between the existing walking path and a future path along 6<sup>th</sup> Ave. SE (Highway 23 Alt.) The path will then provide a route for pedestrians to access the South Park retail development.

This project will be constructed in conjunction with a separate project consisting of widening 7<sup>th</sup> St SE, adding curb and gutter, and street lighting.

Koser Field Walking Trail Grant Information  
**Response to Each Evaluation Criterion**

Site and Project Quality:

The new trail will provide an off-street walking surface for many users.

Near term:

- Children and adults walking or bicycling to the ball field and fishing pond.
- Children and adults walking to or from the adjacent residential development.

Long term:

- Pedestrians walking or bicycling to the South Park retail development.
- Walkers and cyclists connecting to the path along 6<sup>th</sup> Ave SE.

Existing development along 7<sup>th</sup> St SE consists of curb, gutter, and sidewalk adjacent to the housing development. No other off-street walking surfaces exist in the vicinity. The lack of off-street walking surfaces causes most pedestrians and/or cyclists to travel on the street.

Public need for and benefit of project:

- Primary purpose of trail is to improve safety for young people accessing fishing pond and ball field.
- The number of people who would benefit from the project:
  - Cal Ripken team and fans: 20 players at 16 practices and 5 games. 40 parents at 5 games.
  - Softball team and fans: 20 players at 12 practices and 2 games, 40 parents at 2 games.
  - Varsity football fans: 12 vehicles parked along 7<sup>th</sup> St SE at 2 people per vehicle for 4 games.
  - Track fans: 12 vehicles parked along 7<sup>th</sup> St SE at 2 people per vehicle for 2 meets.
  - People fishing at 3 per day from May through July.
  - Pee wee baseball: 12 vehicles parked along 7<sup>th</sup> St SE at 2 people per vehicle for 16 games.

- Tee ball: 12 vehicles parked along 7<sup>th</sup> St SE at 2 people per vehicle for 16 games.
- Fishing derby: 300 people for one day
- Housing development residents walking this route at 10 per day all year.

Context of the project in a wider plan:

- Supports Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan survey results which request more walking paths.
- Supports local recreation survey which requests more walking paths.
- Provides a link to future walking path from existing walking path. See attachment A.


Attention to the potential environmental impact of the project and efforts to mitigate adverse effects:

- Appropriate storm water pollution prevention measures will be taken during construction.
- Upon completion surface erosion will be mitigated by using erosion blankets on slopes adjacent to the fishing pond.
- No impact from noise or odors is expected.
- No impact to fish and wildlife is expected.
- A portion of the west shore of the fishing pond will be replaced with fill from the path. The new shoreline will be clay to match existing shoreline.
- No cultural impact study is planned. All excavation will be within previously disturbed right of way.

Impact on adjoining landowners in the vicinity of the project:

- Watford City owns land directly adjacent to project. No adverse impacts are expected.
- Strata Suites and LSS own housing across the street. Less pedestrian traffic on their sidewalk is expected.
- McKenzie County School owns property to the west of the project. The school storm drain exits into the fishing pond. This storm drain will need to be extended as a result of adding fill dirt.




