Recreational Trails Program(RTP) Grant Application

Recreational Trail Program (RTP) grants are available to the State of North Dakota, political subdivisions, and nonprofit organizations in order to assist in the development, maintenance, or rehabilitation of recreational trails. The RTP is an assistance program of the U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). The program is administered by the Recreation Division of the North Dakota Parks and Recreation Department (NDPRD).

Project proposals must be approved at the state and federal levels. A Recreational Trails Program Advisory Committee (RTPAC) made up of private, state, and federal individuals evaluates and ranks the projects. Projects selected at the state level are submitted to the FHWA for final review and approval.

RTP grants reimburse up to 80 percent of the cost for development, maintenance, or rehabilitation of recreational trails. Engineering fees exceeding more than 20% of total project cost are not eligible for reimbursement. Project sponsors cannot be reimbursed for funds that are incurred before an application is approved and a local grant agreement is signed.

The application cycle is open from December 1, 2015 to January 29, 2016 at 1:00 P.M. CST.

Requirement and Evaluation Criterion:

The City of Fargo and the Fargo Park District continue to plan and construct an extensive shared use path system in Fargo. This project would provide a consistent 10' wide concrete shared use path on what would be the 5th Street alignment between 5th Avenue S and 7th Avenue S, crossing Fargo Park District property. The proposed project is approximately 425' long and is located near to the Fargo School District's Hawthorne Elementary School.

There is an existing shared use path in Island Park that extends from 1st Avenue S to 5th Avenue S and then terminates at that point. Pedestrians and bicyclists at that point wishing to continue further south must either proceed to 7th Street or over to 4th Street to continue. 5th Street from the south ends at 7th Avenue S in this part of the city. It is designated as a "Share the Road" facility between 24th Avenue S and 13th Avenue S, and does pass by the city's largest park, Lindenwood Park. This project would fill in a missing connection between 5th Street and Island Park, and also further to the north, the Broadway district. The project would eliminate one ball field located in the park.

2. Clearly defined goals for the project (with a delineation of which user groups would benefit from the project).

The goal of the project would be to continue the existing path that runs through Island Park and connect to the neighborhood to the south of there. The user groups that will benefit from this new shared use path will be walkers, runners, bicyclists, and in-line skaters. Residents will use this path mostly for recreation, but it could also serve school children riding their bicycle to the Hawthorne Elementary School.

3. Costs associated with the project (with estimates of the following components: material/service purchases including hardware, paint, lumber, sand/gravel concrete, landscape materials, signs, design/engineering services, contractor services, equipment rates, equipment costs, and land lease payments). The costs associated with this project are for construction and engineering. The construction would entail import fill, seeding, 4" concrete shared use path, necessary signing, and erosion control. The estimated construction cost is \$204,400. The City of Fargo would bid this out in early 2017 and plan to have construction completed in late July.

This project was reviewed and approved by Metro COG in December of 2014, the City of Fargo Board of Commissioners in January 2015, as well as the Fargo Park Board of Commissioners in January 2015.

5. Availability/access to 20% match for eligible elements of the project proposal. The City of Fargo Engineering Department is very capable of moving this project into the environmental clearance phase, design phase, and the construction phase.

7. Site and project quality: consideration of the needs of the intended trail user group(s); aesthetic quality of the trail location; appropriateness of the trail for the intended or existing uses; clarity, detail, and quality of project plan/design; quality of existing development (if any) on site or in corridor; attention to safety, accessibility and health considerations.

This project would take place on Fargo Park District land adjacent to Island Park, which is a Fargo treasure. This connection to the neighborhood would fit in like a glove. This part of town is well developed and very walkable and bikeable to the area residents.

As you can see from the attached map of the existing City of Fargo bicycle network, the City of Fargo and the Fargo Park District have planned for an extensive off-street system of shared use paths. This project is one that has been identified by both the City, Parks, and Metro COG.

8. Public need for and benefit of project: safety concerns, urgency of action, potential to lose the opportunity, number of people who would benefit from the project when compared to cost. Why should this project be funded? How many people could be expected to use the trail over the course of the year as a result of funding the project?

It is estimated that this shared use path will see hundreds of daily users between May and October and also some hearty individuals in the winter months. This project should be funded as it would fill in the missing gap between the on-street shared road markings on 5th Street to the south of here, to the shared use path located in Island Park. This would eliminate the need for people to go out of their way to continue south of Island Park.

9. Attention to the potential environmental impact of the project and efforts to mitigate adverse effects: Possible areas of consideration include but are not limited to: noise, odors, dust, surface erosion, fish and wildlife populations, damage to wetlands, or other ecologically sensitive natural resources or historical/archeological remains. All applications are subject to review by the State Historical Society. If sponsor has a recent cultural review letter or document, please include with the application attachments.

The land use adjacent to the proposed project is residential, public and park. This project is compatible to all adjacent land uses. This project will be constructed in an urban environment where the existing farm lands have already been converted to urban areas. Positive social impacts should come from this project due to the improved level of safety and convenience the project will provide to the surrounding land uses and shared use path uses. This project will provide a positive economic impact because the project will be bid, thereby creating work for contractors and suppliers. No relocations will be required. No filling will occur in any wetlands. This project will be located with the 100-yr floodplain. There are no threatened or endangered species in the project area. There are no known properties on or eligible to be on the National Register of Historic Places in the project area.

10. Impact on adjoining landowners in the vicinity of the project: Identify adverse impacts that might be realized as a result of completing the project, and how the project design attempts to mitigate adverse impacts. How might the project improve conditions for adjacent landowners?

The project will be located in park land adjacent to an elementary school, a single family house, and an apartment complex. The design of the path will arc away from the house and apartment as to not disrupt those two properties. This area is wooded, so the tree canopy will help to break down sight lines and buffer the adjacent landowners.
