Administrative Reminders

- Make sure that each board member will submit the final ranking of applications to the Grants Coordinator by Thursday, April 30, 2026.
- The NDPRD Grants Coordinator will compile the ranked applications and notify the board of the ranking results by the beginning of May 2026.
- The recommendations will be submitted to the NDPRD Director for approval in May.
- Grant pre-award notifications will happen after Director approval in June. Please feel free to contact the Grants Coordinator, Char Langehaug, with any questions during this waiting period. As a reminder, there is a 6 to 9-month review period to obtain environmental clearance recommendations and permit approvals for submittal to FHWA. No construction or purchases are allowed on the project until a grant agreement is received and signed. If awarded, October through March is the waiting period during which funds are allocated to the state and obtained from FHWA. The NDPRD Grants Coordinator will notify the applicants of the award through a grant agreement by April. Construction on the project can start after the grant agreement is signed.
