

## Land & Water Conservation Fund Pre-Application

The Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) is a 50/50 matching grant program administered at the state level by the North Dakota Parks and Recreation Department (NDPRD) and funded at the federal level by the U.S. Department of Interior, National Park Service (NPS). The LWCF provides grants for outdoor recreation projects such as ball fields, pools, campgrounds, playgrounds, and land acquisitions for park development.

The following entities (only political subdivisions of the state of North Dakota with ownership of the project land) are eligible and may apply:

- Cities, counties, and townships
- Park boards and park districts
- School districts
- State agencies
- Water management districts
- Federally-recognized Indian tribes

- Copy of proposed budget including source(s) of funding (Grant awards will be based upon proposed total budgets.)
