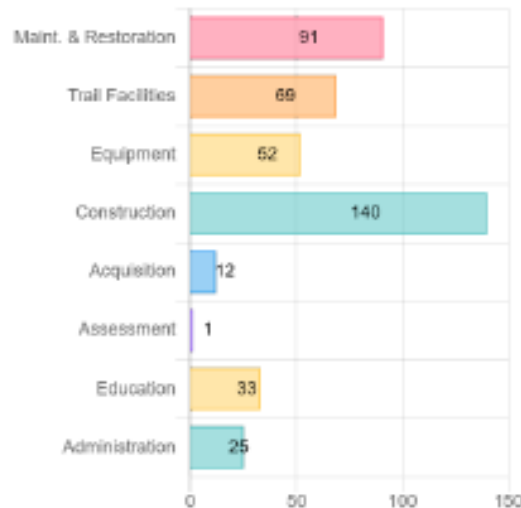

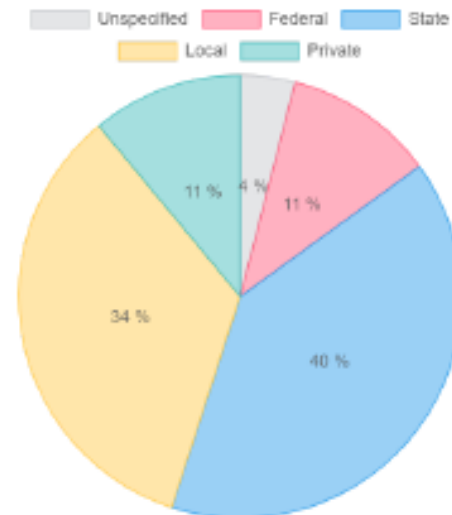
PERMISSIBLE USES

Any project may report more than one (or may not specify a) Land Owner Type for each project. Therefore, the number of projects listed in each category may not add up to the total number of projects for the State.

WHAT IS THE RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM?

- Established by Congress in 1993
- 80/20 Grant Program for Trail Projects
- Applicants may request grant amounts ranging from a minimum of \$30,000 up to a maximum of \$250,000.



WHAT CAN BE FUNDED?

- Purchase and lease of recreational trail construction and maintenance equipment

- Build America, Buy America Requirement

Examples:

- Trail Brush Mowers
- Cross Country Ski Trail Groomers

- Construction of new trails

Examples:

- Forestry Trail in Bottineau, ND
- Northern Cass Pass in Hunter/Arthur, ND

- Restoration of existing trails

Examples:

- Maah Daah Hey Trail, Medora, ND

- Development and rehabilitation of trailside and trailhead facilities and trail linkages

Examples:

- Riparian Park Rehabilitation, Valley City, ND
- Lewis and Clark Trailside Facilities, Mandan, ND

- Land acquisition/easements

- Trail accessibility assessment



WHO CAN APPLY?

The following entities are eligible and may apply:

- Cities, counties, and townships
- Park boards and park districts
- State and federal agencies
- Registered non-profit organizations
- Federally-recognized tribes

***Please note: Only federal, state, and municipal agencies qualify for funding of equipment for recreational trail construction and maintenance.**



TITLE VI REQUIREMENT

The law provides that:

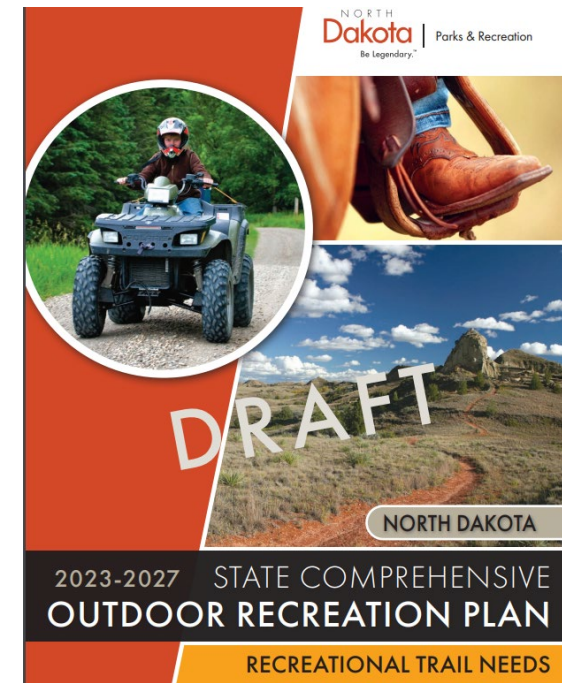
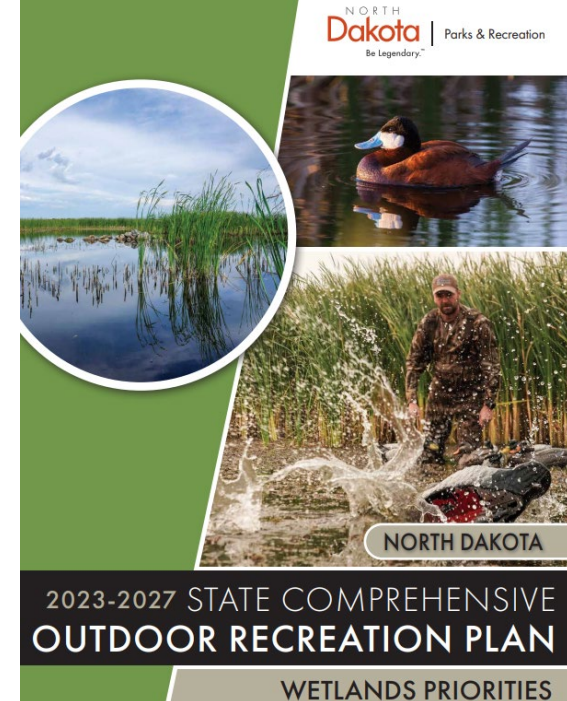
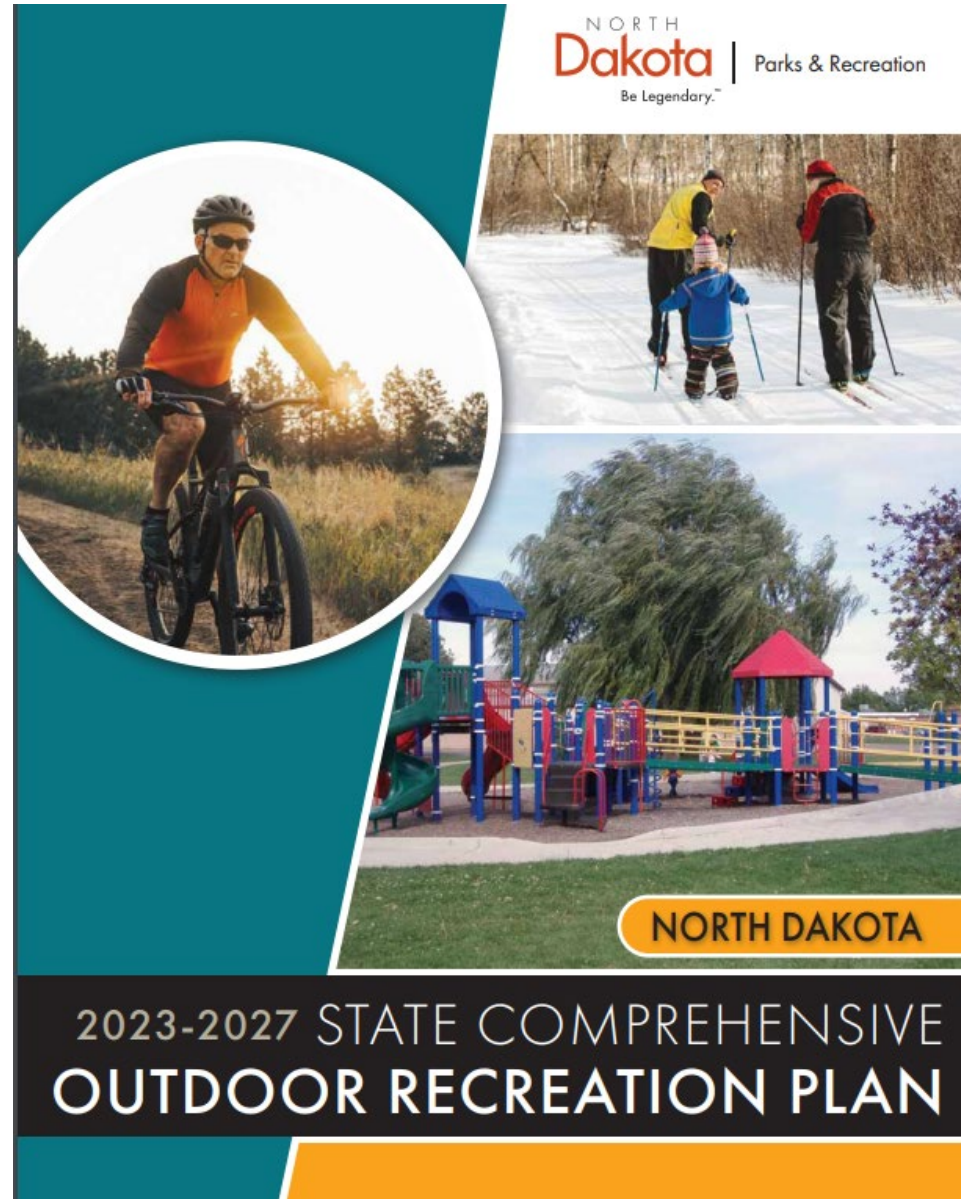
