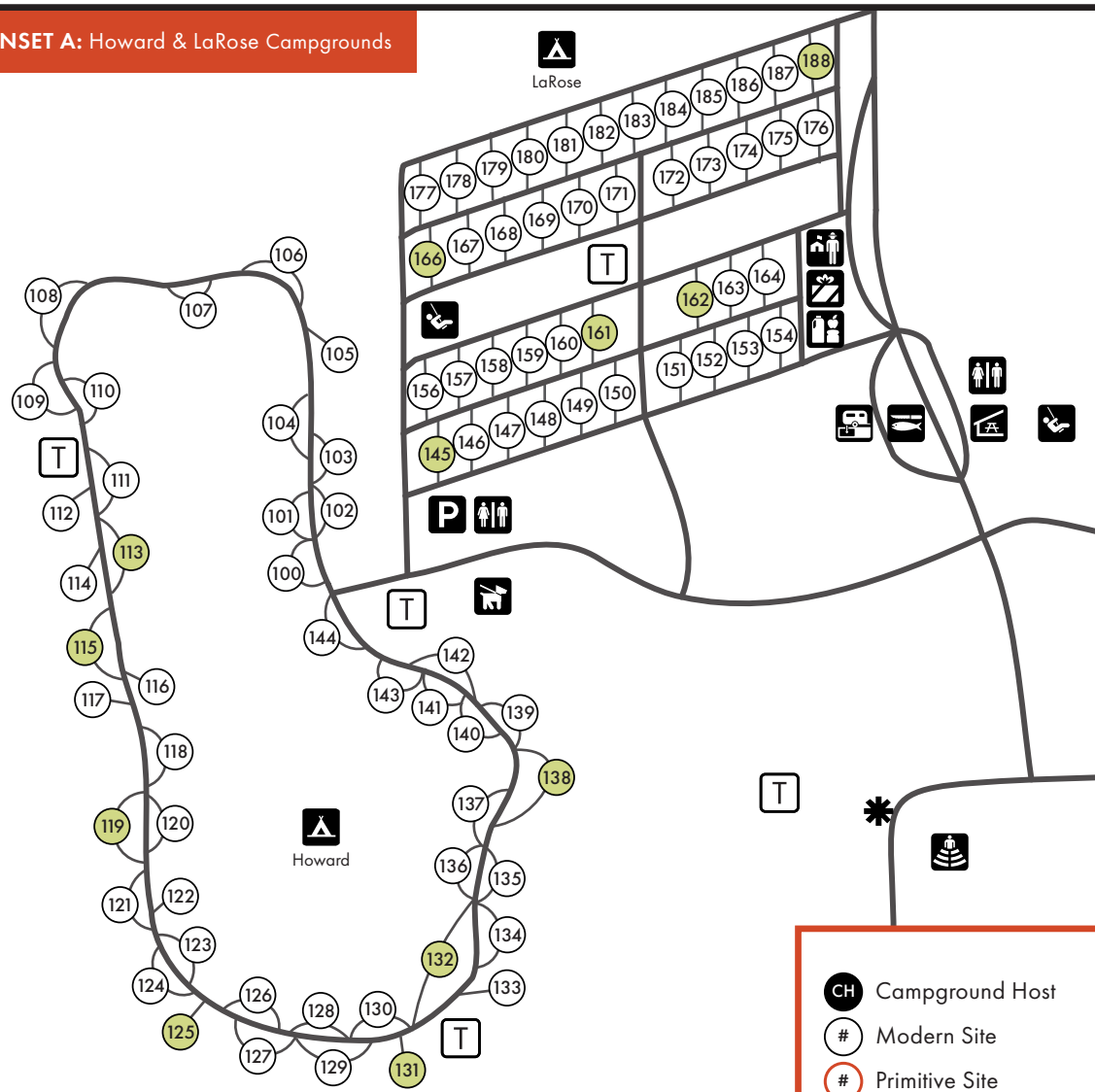

#### PARK HOURS

The park is open daily from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. for use year-round.



#### CAMPGROUND QUIET HOURS

Quiet hours are between 10 p.m. – 7 a.m. year-round. Generator usage is allowed from 8 a.m. – 8 p.m.



#### FIREWOOD

To help prevent the spread of invasive species, we ask that visitors do not bring or use out-of-state firewood. Collecting firewood in the park is prohibited. Firewood is for sale at the Visitor Center.



#### PETS ON LEASHES

Pets are welcome but must stay on a leash while in the state park. A dog park is located on the south side of the park.



#### EMERGENCY INFO

In an emergency dial 911. Find fire danger ratings and restrictions at [ndresponse.gov](http://ndresponse.gov).

### VISITOR TIPS

- Please follow speed limits in the park and keep an eye out for animals and visitors utilizing the park.
- Wild animals do live in the park, please keep a safe distance, and respect their habitat.
- **Camping:** check-in is at 4 p.m., checkout is at 3 p.m.
- **Overnight rentals:** check-in is 4 p.m., check-out is at noon

### MUST SEE & DO

- While hiking the Sivert Thompson Loop Trail, watch for birds along with 130 different plant species that are native to the island.
- Check out our bait shop before enjoying world-class fishing on Devils Lake. The park offers a four-lane boat ramp and fish cleaning station in addition to two fishing docks.
- Cool off with an afternoon at the swim beach southeast of the cabins.
- Stop by the Visitor Center to check out a Young Explorer Field Pack, which comes equipped with field guides, activity booklets, field equipment and other supplies that are handy for exploring nature.

### MORE TO EXPLORE

- Play a round of horseshoes or a game of sand volleyball. Horseshoes are available at the Visitor Center.
- Download the free geocaching app, hit the trails and find several geocaches located within the park.
- Take your dog to burn off some energy at the fenced-in dog park located south of the Visitor Center.
- Have some fun with the kids at one or all four of the playgrounds located within the park.

### VISITING IN WINTER

- Grab your cross-country skis and explore the three miles of groomed trail that winds through the trees along the shore of Devils Lake, offering beautiful views of the park.
- The world-class fishing doesn't stop in the winter. Grab your rod and try your luck at catching walleye, perch, and northern pike.
- Strap on some snowshoes and explore the lake or some of the less traversed areas of the park.
