

• Grab your cross-country skis and explore the three miles of groomed trail that winds through the trees along the shore of Devils Lake, offering beautiful views of the park.

• The world-class fishing doesn't stop in the winter. Grab your rod and try your luck at catching walleye, perch, and northern pike.

• Strap on some snowshoes and explore the lake or some of the less traversed areas of the park.
