Fort Abraham Lincoln Living History Garrison | August 13-14, 2022

Join Company B for an event that will see the return of the living history encampments to Fort Abraham Lincoln State Park. This weekend, visit and learn from the soldiers of Company B, 6th US Infantry who built, occupied, and defended Fort Abraham Lincoln during the summer of 1873 prior to the arrival of the 7th US Cavalry Regiment under Lt. Col. George A. Custer on September 21.

During this time, attacks had been made against the fort during the fall of 1872 and in May and June 1873. Patrols and heightened awareness were the norm for these infantrymen on the western Dakota frontier. Expect to find reenactors encamped on the parade grounds of old Fort Abraham Lincoln, showcasing the rigors of frontier garrison life such as patrols, guard and fatigue duty, drill, etc.

Come talk to the recreated Company B of the 6th US Infantry Regiment about life on the frontier, or watch from afar. Many of these reenactors have travelled from across the region to come and relive the life of a soldier here at the state park. Alongside the infantry, there will be a portion of reenactors portraying civilian laborers as well as a number of vendors present who will have their various crafts and wares available for sale.
