

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PARK ENTRANCE FEES

Vehicles must display a valid park entrance permit year-round.

- Daily vehicle entrance fee \$7
- Annual vehicle entrance permit \$35
- Annual family entrance permit \$55

Purchase of annual vehicle entrance permit is available online at www.parkrec.nd.gov, at the North Dakota Parks & Recreation Department Bismarck Office, through the Call Center at 800-807-4723 or at any state park.

Senior Discount: ND residents age 65 and older are eligible to purchase an annual entrance permit for \$28. Not available for purchase online.

Disabled Veterans and POWs: ND veterans with a 50 percent or greater service-related disability and former POWs are eligible for a free annual lifetime pass. All other ND veterans with service-related disabilities may purchase an annual permit for \$28.

Library Loan Program: A daily park pass can be checked out by library card holders for no charge at most North Dakota public libraries.

CAMPING FEES

Camping fees do not include entrance fees. A daily or annual permit is required in addition to the fees listed below.

The full-service camping season runs from mid-May to mid or late-September. Limited services are available in the off-season. Little Missouri State Park is only open seasonally May-October.

MISCELLANEOUS FEES

Horses: Riding is allowed at Fort Ransom, Fort Abraham Lincoln, Sully Creek and Little Missouri State Parks and the Pembina Gorge State Recreation Area. Horse permits may be purchased at the parks or online.

OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE (OHV) FEES

Residents: The registration fee for ND resident OHVs operating on public lands and trails is \$20 and is available through NDDOT. The registration period is for two years beginning October 1 of each even-numbered year.

Non-residents: Owners of out-of-state registered OHVs must purchase a non-resident public trails and lands access permit. Permits are \$10/year and can be purchased at any ND state park or online at travel.parkrecnd.com.

SNOWMOBILE FEES

Residents: The registration fee for ND resident snowmobiles operating on public lands and trails is \$50 and is available through NDDOT. The registration period is for two years beginning October 1 of each odd-numbered year.

Non-residents: Owners of out-of-state registered snowmobiles must purchase a non-resident public trails and lands access permit. Permits are \$25/year and can be purchased at any ND state park or online at travel.parkrecnd.com.

MARINA FEES

RESERVATIONS

Reservations for North Dakota state park campgrounds can be made:

100% campsite and cabin reservations are available in all state parks

- Reservations for cabins, yurts and shelters can be made up to 365 days in advance online or through the call center.
- Reservations for dorms and group or meeting facilities can be made up to 365 days in advance by calling the park directly.
- Reservations for campsites can be made within 95 days of the date of arrival. Stays are limited to 14 nights within any 30-day period. Stays may be limited to three days when the campsite is not being used for recreation purposes.
- To help determine the 95-day window for reservations, a calendar including all dates for the season can be found online at www.parkrec.nd.gov/stay
- Online reservations can be made 24/7 with exception of the first day of the 95-day window; These reservations will be available at 7 a.m. Central Standard Time.
- Reservations for cabins and yurts can be made until noon the day before arrival. Campsite reservations can be made up to the minute of arrival.
- Full payment is required to confirm reservations. Reservation change and cancel fees apply. The reservation fee is non-refundable (see fee schedule which follows). NDPRD accepts Discover, Visa and MasterCard credit cards.
- Call Center reservations are limited to five resources during one phone call. For large group gathering, when 10 or more adjacent campsites are desired, call the park directly.
- On holidays and weekends, a two- or three-

night cabin or yurt may be required.

- Campsite check-in is after 4 p.m. and check-out is by 3 p.m. Full service cabin/yurt check-in is after 4 p.m. and check-out is 12 p.m. Camping cabin check-in is after 4 p.m. and check-out is 12 p.m.

SEASONAL LODGING

These seasonal lodging facilities are available during the full-service season from mid-May to mid- or late-September.

Camping Cabins

Small one-room cabins are available during the full-service season at the state parks listed below. Each cabin can sleep up to five, bunkbed-style with one full and three twins and is equipped with lights, heat, air conditioning, fan and either a deck or patio. No cooking is allowed inside. No showers, sink or toilet. Comfort stations are available for use. Users are responsible for providing bedding and towels. No pets are allowed in cabins.

Woodland Cabins

There are 10 units available during the full-service season at Turtle River State Park. Eight units sleep up to six each. Two of the units are ADA compliant and sleep up to three each. All units equipped with air conditioning, heat, private shower and toilets. Users are responsible for providing bedding and towels.

Covered Wagon

Available during the full-service season at Fort Ransom State Park. The wagon has a king bed, and a set of twin bunk beds. It also includes a refrigerator, microwave, four barstools around a wagon wheel table and air conditioning. Users are responsible for providing bedding and towels.

Primitive Cabins:

Arthur A. Link Centennial Cabin is available year-round and sleeps up to six. Limited dishes and utensils, a coffee pot and mini fridge, are available. The cabin has a propane fireplace and wood-burning cook stove along with picnic tables and fire ring outside. No running water or indoor toilet. Shower facilities are available year-round at the Visitor Center.

John Colter Cabin is available year-round and sleeps up to five. It has two bedrooms, electric heat, overhead lights and a wood-burning fireplace. Camp stove and cooking utensils are not provided.

Full-Service Cabin:

The York Cabin has air conditioning, charcoal grill, electricity, fire ring, full bathroom, full kitchen, gas fireplace, heat and picnic tables. The cabin is accessible and sleeps six with a queen bedroom, queen bed in the loft and a pull out couch.

Full-Service Cabin \$125/night

Primitive Yurts:

The Bagnell and Ice Glider Yurts are twin yurts located within the main campground at Cross Ranch. These yurts sleep five and have a bunk bed and a pullout futon. A gas fireplace, kitchen table, and a small refrigerator are located inside the yurts. A vault toilet is located nearby, and shower facilities are available year-round at the Visitor Center.

Levis Yurt is equipped with a gas stove. This yurt sleeps up to three people with a futon couch and futon chair. The yurt is equipped with lighting, a refrigerator, table with bench seating, outdoor picnic table and fire ring. No cooking allowed inside. Running water and a vault toilet are located nearby.

Primitive Yurt \$65/night

Full-Service Yurt: Pretty Point Yurt offers a kitchen, two bedrooms (full size beds), pull out couch, bathroom, loft, gas heat and fireplace, and air conditioning. Sleeps 6.

The Commissary: Available year-round for indoor meetings and events with seating and tables for up to 150. Meeting room equipped with WiFi, coffeemaker, microwave, DVD player, TV, sink and refrigerator.

Full-Service Cabin: The Bjone House offers heat, air conditioning, gas grill, propane fireplace, gas stove, a full kitchen with electric range, bathroom, and three queen bedrooms. It also includes a deck overlooking the river.

Seasonal Cabins:

The Percheron Wagon has a king bed and a set of twin bunk beds. It also includes a refrigerator, microwave, four barstools around a wagon wheel table and air conditioning.

The Nils Olson is a homey cabin built for two and open seasonally. The cabin is a single room with a bed, table, refrigerator and recliner.

Full-Service Yurts: Two full-service yurts are available year-round and are equipped with electric heating, air conditioning, propane fireplace, kitchen, bathroom, two bedrooms (full beds), pull out couch, a loft and sleep up to six people. Both yurts are accessible and include a large deck, picnic tables, and fire ring.

Sodbuster Building includes indoor kitchen and seating with tables for 64. No utensils. Available mid-May to Oct. 1

Camping Cabins: Three cabins are available seasonally and each sleep five, bunk bed style with one full and three twins. Each cabin is equipped with lights, heat, air conditioning, small refrigerator and a deck. Cooking is not allowed inside, but a grill and picnic table are located outside.

Full-Service Cabins: Two units available year-round. Each unit sleeps four with a bunk bed and full bed. Each cabin has air conditioning, heat, WiFi, a bathroom and a kitchen.

Camping Cabins: Three cabins are available seasonally and each sleep five, bunk bed style with one full and three twins. Amenities include air conditioning, electricity, heat, small refrigerator and fire ring. Cooking is not allowed inside, but a fire ring with cooking grate and picnic table are located outside.

Group Facilities:

Akra Hall can seat up to 150. It includes a catering kitchen with refrigerator, sink and service counter. Available from May 15 - September 30. Two-day rental minimum on weekends and holidays.

Primitive/Semi-Primitive Cabins:

Cormorant sleeps 4 (1 full, 1 full futon) and is available year-round. Includes a refrigerator, stove, microwave, charcoal grill, fire ring, picnic table and electric heat. There is no running water at the cabin. There is a vault toilet located on site.

Osprey is available year-round and sleeps up to 6 (2 singles and 2 full beds with sleeping pads). Those staying at this cabin must hike, bike or canoe to it as there is no motorized vehicle access to this cabin. There is a vault toilet, picnic table and fire ring with cooking grate on site. A wood burning stove is located in the cabin. Split wood is available. Two propane lanterns are provided for lighting.

Primitive Cabins \$60/night

Primitive Yurt:

The Blue Heron Yurt sleeps 4 (1 full, 1 single, 1 queen futon). There is a vault toilet at the site along with a charcoal grill, fire ring and picnic table. Heat is from a gas fireplace and there is electricity and a small fridge.

Primitive yurt \$65/night

Full Service Cabins:

Loon Lodge Cabin sleeps 4 (1 queen, 2 singles) and includes a gas fireplace, full kitchen, 3/4 bathroom with accessible shower, charcoal grill, fire ring, picnic table, deck and WiFi.

White Pelican Cabin sleeps 6 (1 queen, 2 singles, 1 queen futon) and includes a gas fireplace, full kitchen, 3/4 bathroom with accessible shower, charcoal grill, fire ring, picnic table, deck and WiFi.

Slemmen Lodge sleeps up to 8 (1 queen, 3 queen futons). It includes a gas fireplace, full kitchen, 3/4 bathroom with accessible shower, charcoal grill, fire ring, picnic table, deck and WiFi.

Group dorms are available year-round. There are two group dorms each sleep 60 bunk bed style. Comfort station is adjacent to dorm buildings.

 There are 10 Woodland Cabins available during the full-service season (Mid-May to Mid-September, weather dependent). Eight units sleep up to six. Two units are accessible and sleep up to three each. All equipped with shower, toilet, air conditioning and heat.

GUIDELINES

Policies governing use of North Dakota State Parks are published in the North Dakota Administrative Code, Chapter 58-02-08. The full text is available at www.parkrec.nd.gov. Failure to obey these rules may result in verbal or written warning, summons and complaint, fine and/or loss of park privileges.

- Additional information about facility policies is available either online or at the park.
- A park can limit the length of stay to three nights when a customer is not using a campsite or overnight facility for recreational purposes.
- Must be 18 year of age or older to rent park campsites and facilities.
- Fires must be contained in designated fire rings and attended by an adult at all times. Campfires may be prohibited based on the ND Fire Danger Rating Map.
- Contact park for rules, regulations and insurance requirements for rental of group facilities or shelters.

RESERVATIONS

- Reservations for campsites, cabins, horse sites, shelters and yurts must be made either through the reservation system (www.travel.parkrecnd.com/) or by calling 1-800-807-4723. Reservations for dorms and group and meeting facilities must be made by calling the park.
- Reservations for cabins, yurts, shelters, and group facilities are accepted 365 days in advance.
- Reservations for campsites are accepted 95 days in advance. A credit card is required to make a reservation, and is charged at the time the reservation is made.
- A non-refundable reservation fee is charged regardless of how the reservation is made.

CAMPSITES

- Camping allowed on designated campsites only. One camping unit per campsite allowed (maximum of six people or immediate family), unless the site is designated as a group or multiple site.
- Campsite check-in is after 4 p.m. Check-out by 3 p.m.
- Campsite and cabin occupancy is limited to no more than 14 nights in any 30-day period.


CABINS

- Cabin and group facility users are expected to do general cleaning prior to vacating, including sweeping, wiping down surfaces and collecting and bagging trash.
- On holidays and weekends, a minimum two- or three-night cabin or yurt stay may be required.
- Full-service cabin/yurt check-in is after 4 p.m. Check-out is 12 p.m.
- Cabin/dorm/yurt visitors must provide bedding, towels and soap.
- No smoking in cabins and facilities.
- No cooking inside camping cabins or primitive yurts.
- Full-service cabins and yurts may not have all amenities traditionally available including, pots, pans, cooking utensils, dinnerware, coffee machines and more. For specific information about your upcoming rental, please contact your park before you visit.
- No game or fish cleaning in or around cabins or group facilities. Contact park staff for other arrangements.
- Users must adhere to all park rules and regulations posted in each facility.

PETS

- No pets are allowed inside cabins or indoor facilities.
- Pets must be kept on a leash and attended at all times.
- Pet waste must be bagged and disposed of in an appropriate manner.
